RESPONSIBILITIES OF A JAZZ FESTIVAL VOLUNTEER

- You will be a Festival ambassador! You are expected to contribute to a non-discriminatory, inclusive and respectful environment.
- You will be expected to fulfill the duties as required by your supervisor within the volunteer role that you signed up for.
- Make sure you are familiar with your Coordinator and that they have your correct phone number, email, and address, and that you have his/her correct contact information as well.
- If you are unable to come to an assigned shift, please contact your Coordinator as soon as possible. GJF expects **at least 48 hrs notice prior to your scheduled shift**, unless it's an emergency.
- You are expected to arrive to your shift on time and ready to work.
- You must wear your Volunteer T-shirt at all times while on shift. Once off shift, you must return to normal street clothes so that it is clear that you are not on shift.
- No alcohol/drug consumption is allowed while on duty, or while wearing the crew t-shirt during the Festival. You must be sober for the duration of your shift.
- You must help maintain a safe environment for patrons and volunteers. You are required to report any dangers to your supervisor.
